
During her free time Dr. White enjoys spending time with her family at Lake Lure, riding horses with

How Laser Therapy Works:

This is the same therapy used by professional sports teams to treat their players. Research shows light stimulation at specific wavelengths (red and near-infrared) interacts with tissues at the cellular level by increasing circulation, oxygenation and metabolic activity. This improves the transportion of nutrients across cellular membranes which stimulates cellular function and repair.

Therapeutic Effects:

During each painless treatment, laser stimulation creates a biochemical reaction which increases circulation, drawing oxygen and nutrients to the damaged area. This creates an optimal healing environment that reduces inflammation, swelling, muscle spasms, stiffness and pain.



What to Expect:

No sedation or restraint is required. Most patients enjoy the treatment and experience pleasant, comforting sessions.

Although improvement is often seen after the first treatment, most patients require several therapy sessions to receive the greatest benefit. Class IV Laser Therapy treatments are cumulative in nature. The length and frequency of treatments varies with your pet's condition. A typical treatment series is three treatments the first week, two treatments the second week and one treatment the third week. The veterinarian will recommend a treatment plan based on your pet's specific needs.

"Booster" treatments are given to maintain the therapeutic effect. Although the booster treatment range is considered to be three to eight weeks, the average is around four to five weeks. An informed and observant owner is the best judge of when a booster treatment is needed.

Reintroduction to Activity

Many pets experience renewed energy and increased freedom of movement. Consult your veterinarian before allowing your pet to return to full activity. A gradual introduction of activity may be required to keep from aggravating the condition or reinjuring the site.



Frequently Asked Questions:

What does treatment feel like? There is little or no sensation during treatment. Occasionally the patient will experience a mild, soothing warmth or tingling.

Are there any side effects? During more than twenty years of use, very few side effects have been reported. Occasionally some old injuries or pain syndromes may feel aggravated for a few days as the healing process is more active after treatment.

How long does a treatment take? The typical therapy time is three to eight minutes per treatment site.

How many treatments does it take? That depends on the condition. For some acute conditions one to two treatments may be sufficient. For chronic conditions, a series of five to eight treatments may be needed. Some conditions may require periodic "booster" treatments to maintain the effect.

How long before results are felt? Your pet may feel improvement in their condition (usually pain reduction) after the first treatment. Sometimes, depending on the condition, it takes several treatments to experience results. Laser Therapy has a cumulative effect and results are often seen after three or four treatments.
